



SKAVEN COPPER ENGINE

Step by Step using the @greenstuffworld paints: How to paint a skaven copper engine.



1. Basecoat of Choco Brown.



2. First highlight with a heavy drybrush with Ember Orange.



3. Second highlight with a 50% mix of Ember Orange and Faded Orange, also drybrushing.



4. The third highlight is made by a soft drybrush with Faded Orange only.



5. Keep highlighting with a 50% mix of Faded Orange and Banana Split.



6. The final highlight is made with a carefully and soft drybrush with a 50% mix of Banana Split and Ivory Tusk.



7. Start the shadows works with a couple of coats of Radiant Orange Dip Ink.



8. Continue with a coat of Red Opulence Dip Ink.

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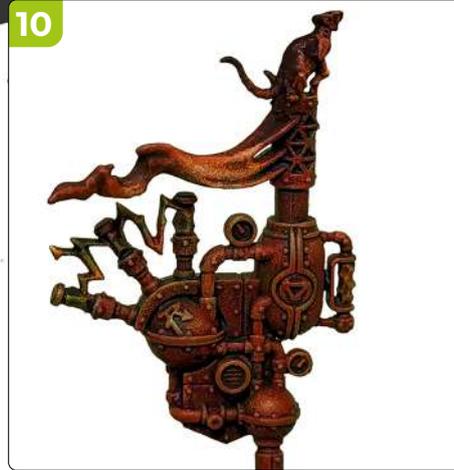

9. Another coat of Garnet Purple Dip ink, but this time only on the lower half of the engine.



10. Final shadows with a pair of coat of diluted Forest Green on all the surface.



11. Now re-highlight the edges, rivets, details and maximum light areas with a 70/30 mix of Ivory Tusk and Faded Orange.



12. To recover a reddish tone, apply a couple of glazes with very diluted Red Truth (80% water).



13. Create some oxide effects by adding a bit of Tropical Turquoise on some of the recesses of the engine.

14. This is the final result with the other elements finished (green lightnings, fiery smoke, the rat) and some extra outlining and light points with pure Ivory Tusk.
