

## STEEL NMM WEAPON

Step by Step using the @greenstuffworld paints: how to paint a steel Non Metallic Metal shotgun.



1. Matt black priming.



2. First highlight with a 50% mix of Black and Bluegrey Dusk, covering everything but the deeper recesses of the weapon.



3. Second highlight, this time only with Bluegrey Dusk defining the main volumes of the weapon.



4. The third highlight is made with a 50% mix of Ivory Tusk and Bluegrey Dusk, on the upper half of the main volumes.



5. Keep highlighting with a 50% mix of Bluegrey Dusk and Nuclear White.



6. The final highlight is made with a 10/90 mix of Bluegrey Dusk and Nuclear White.

7. The first shadows works consists in a soft glaze of diluted Tropical Turquoise. It also smooths the transitions.

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8. Recover the maximum lights with 2-3 coats of slightly diluted Nuclear White.

9. Apply now a couple of coats of highly diluted 50% mix of Cutthroat Red and Liche Purple, only in the shadows zones. This will enrich the color and contrast of the weapon.



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10. Finally, I use pure Black and pure White to outline both the deeper zones and edges to get the maximum definition of all the parts of the weapon.
